

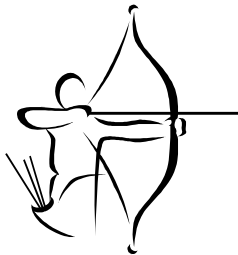


EDITORIAL

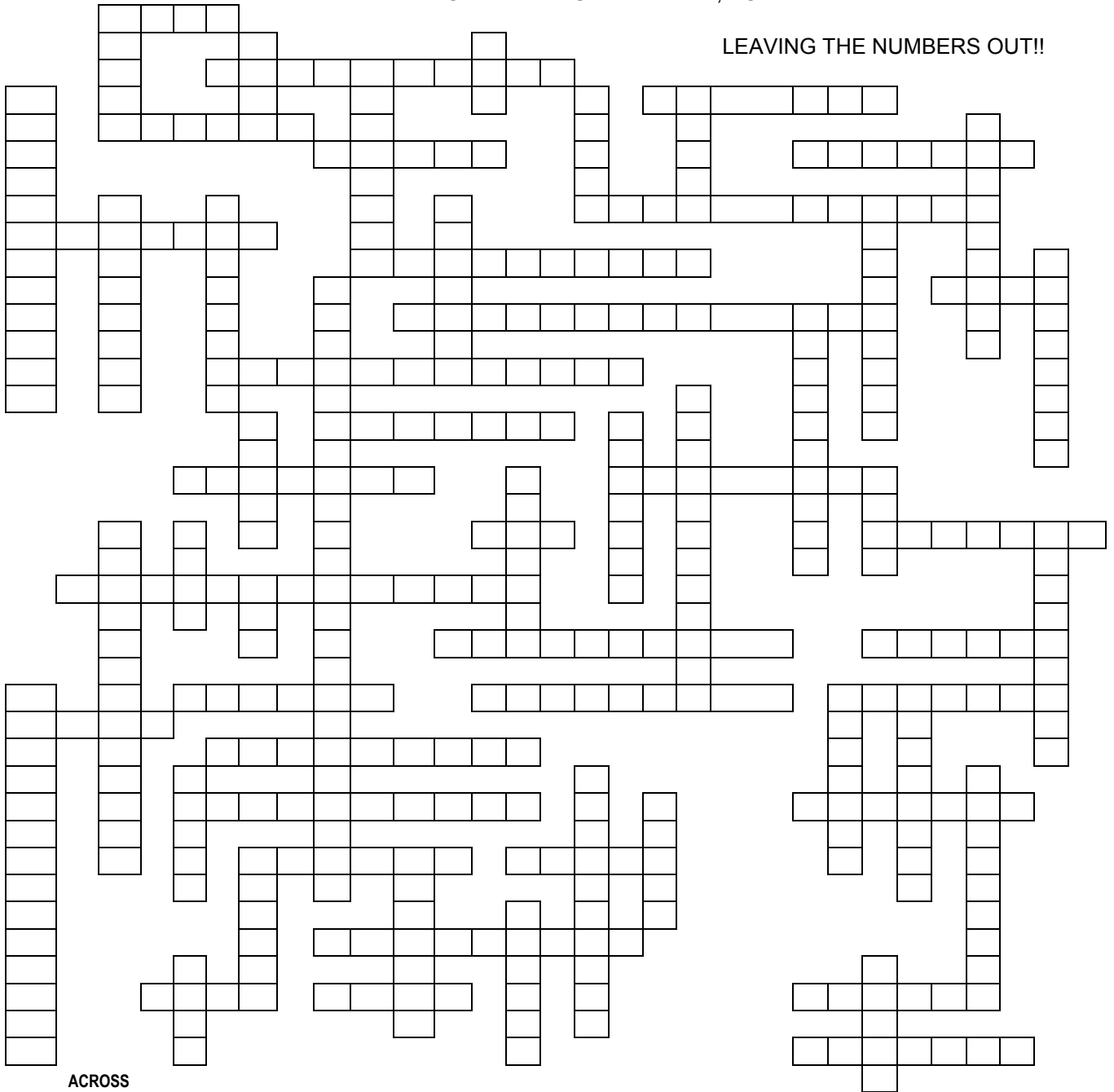
