NEWS FROM YOUR JUDGES

NATIONAL JUDGES CONFERENCE, LILLESHALL 2008

Ann and I travelled up to Lilleshall, around 250 miles, for the conference. My first task was to hand in all the bow scales from the county's judges for checking, as I was the only one able to attend. The first day started at 1.30 with a welcome by the National Judges Chairman. About 60 judges of all levels attended.

Peter Fairbrother gave us an insight to the new judges web page where we can find all information neeeded. The websight will be updated every month.

A report and many photos from the Dover World Cup, with a talk that gave us a very good look at how the shoot was controlled, with information on any problems that arised. It was noted that a GNAS judge was not afraid to give a decision and stand by it, yes we are the best trained in the world.

Lynne Evans gave us an insite into future events, both international and world to be held in this country.

Judges topics for discussion included that all shoots should have a qualified first aid person, and not rely on the hope that one would not be needed. From the committee we were informed that a new shoot assessment form will be coming out to be filled in for all competition shoots, these forms to be forwarded to the Judges committee. After this we broke up to get changed into greens and whites for a dinner arranged by the committee, held in the Chapters Resteraunt, a lovely meal, thank you GNAS. Sunday started a 9 am with a talk and demonstration of the new timing equipment by Graham Potts, who used it at the Dover World Cup.

Hannah and Katy, both SCAS Judges, gave us a presentation of slides and a talk on the training of judges and how to encourage archers who may be interested in becoming judges.

We had a discussion period on how to spot and deal with archers who cheat.

After lunch our guest speaker was Anne Webb talking on the future of the Paraplegic Archers. In 2009 FITA will be taking over the control of Para Archery from the IPC. There will be a separate disabled section in the FITA Rule book, as judges we will need to recognise 5 separate groups of archers within the Para archery group. A more detailed report about this can be had from Colin & Ann.

A training topic from Graham Potts covering the equipment that Judges needed to carry and why, there were many suggestions from a camera to a hammer!!

Nearing the end of the conference we had any last questions and were all given a very handy measuring device to help with max size of arrow shaft, pile, over draw and the light gathering neon strip.

The chairman closed the conference.

GRAND WESTERN ARCHERY SOCIETY COACHING ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2008


The GWAS AGM was held at West Buckland on Sunday 13th April 2008, approximately 20 coaches attended, Devon and Cornwall were represented.

DEATH OF A PAST D.C.A.S. CHAMPION

1923 Mrs Elizabeth 'Bet' Nettleton 2008

Mrs Nettleton was a member of Exmoor Archers half a century ago. Mrs Nettleton and her husband Eddie started the sport of Archery after moving to South Molton in 1950, and together with their sons Leslie and Ivan, all held Championship titles at various times.

For some years she was the Devon and Cornwall Ladies Champion and won the Manadon Bowl several times. She went on to become a British Ladies Champion Archer and held the British records for scores in the National, International and Indoor rounds.

In 1955 she was offered a place in the British Ladies Archery Team for the 1956 Olympic Games in Helsinki. At that time competitors were 'true amateurs' and as a working mother with 3 sons she had to decline the offer as she could not have borne the expense involved.

Her archery success continued after she and Eddie Moved to South Wales in 1960, and joined St David's Bowmen, based in Cardiff. Bet quickly became Welsh Ladies Champion. Her husband Eddie was constantly competing alongside her in the men's events but although sometimes successful, never achieved quite the same consistent success.

Her final days of competitive shooting came after moving discipline to Field Shooting. Once again she rapidly rose to become the Welsh Ladies Champion, whilst her husband Eddie was the Welsh Men's Champion.

Mrs Elizabeth Nettleton, ne Pengelly and known as 'Bet' to many was born on 2^{nd} April 1923 in Okehampton and died peacefully of 4^{th} March 2008 in Penarth, South Wales after a very long period of ill health.
