Do you want to be considered for the county team or county squad?

DCAS is once again running squad training sessions over the indoor season, if you are interested in attending you must complete a Squad Application form to be considered for a place.

The county team will compete in two events in 2017. Each event has a separate selection procedure and archers need to complete selection forms to be considered.

Senior National Intercounties 2017

The above event is being held at Lilleshall National Sports Centre on the weekend of June 24th/25th and consists of WA720 and team head to head on the Saturday and WA1440 on the Sunday.

In order to qualify for selection, you must shoot four 12 dozen rounds at a minimum distance appropriate to your gender (These can include double WA720 rounds for this event). These rounds must be shot between the last event (24th June 2016) and the cut off date (expected to be towards the end of May and will be confirmed when the prospectus is published).

So that the county can get the team entry in before selecting the archers, we need to make sure sufficient archers are available in each category. Therefore, those interested in representing the county at this event are required to complete a pre-selection form and return by 31st January 2017 and then follow this up with the main selection form in May.

Senior GWAS Intercounties 2017

The above event is being held at Exeter School in September.

In order to qualify for selection, you must shoot four 12 dozen rounds during the 2017 season at a minimum distance appropriate to your gender. One of these rounds must be shot between the last weekend in July and the 30th August.



GRAND WESTERN REGIONAL AND INTERCOUNTIES JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP 2016



On Sunday 03rd September 2016 the juniors who were chosen to represent Devon & Cornwall attended the Junior Inter-Counties. Although the weather was extremely challenging, being both wet and having a very strong and gusty wind they all performed brilliantly. American Department of Defense Warrior Games 2016

On the 17th June, 2016 - David Cousins had an amazing opportunity to represent the United Kingdom as a member of the UK Armed Forces team at West Point Military Academy, New York. Below is his report on the event.

The Warrior Games 2016 archery event was held on 17th June 2016 and the UK Armed Forces put together a full team of 12 archers (6 Recurve and 6 Compound). This was probably one of the most amazing and nerve racking tournaments I have ever been to and from the very start the atmosphere was electric. The crowd cheered on the archers throughout the shoot from the very first arrow to the last (even as we shot).

Only the top 8 qualified through to the Individual Head to Head matches and the UK Recurve team had an amazing result taking 1st (Keith Robertson, who also got the Recurve Individual games record), 2nd (Gavin Watson), 3rd (David Cousins) and 6th (Mark Martin-Davy). Unfortunately, only three UK archers could make it through to the second round of the Head to Head so I was drawn against Mark in the first round. After four ends of shooting we were tied on a score of 97 (accumulative scoring) so had to go to a one arrow shoot off which ended close but Marks 8 just beat my 7.

The three remaining Recurve archers did an amazing job and managed to get the clean sweep in the medals with Keith Robertson taking 1st, Gavin Watson 2nd & Mark Martin-Davy 3rd.

Then came the team round. It was very tight on the shooting line, with all three archers on the line/ the first archer shoots an arrow and raises their hand and shouts 'GO', the next archer shoots and so on.. It was a great result for the UK team of myself, Keith & Gavin as we managed to hold ourselves together and go on to win the team round and claim the Recurve team games record.

The UK Compound team also did well in the team round with a 5th place finish and despite not qualifying for the individual head to head there was a lot of PB's shot.

Overall it was an amazing experience and I had the chance to shoot with some very inspiring people, many of whom are now friends and I hope that I shall have the opportunity of competing in this event again in the future.

What are you doing to promote archery in the community.??


If like me, you love archery, I ask what are you doing to let others know about this great sport.?



Archery GB January Challenge.!!

Last year there were very nearly 2000 entries making this one of the largest single competitions held in the UK. There are classes for gender and bow style and each class is divided into three groupings, for those who have taken up archery in the previous 12 months, those who have been shooting for over 25 years, and those in between.

The round shot is a Portsmouth, which is perhaps the most commonly shot indoor round at clubs so contact your records officer and get your scores in.!!

Record Claims

Please remember that DCAS (County) record claims must be made within four weeks and GWAS (Regional) record claims within three months. The claim form for DCAS records can be downloaded from our DCAS website and the regional form from the GWAS site. All regional record claims *must* be sent via the DCAS CRO so that they can be ratified before forwarding to GWAS. Scores at any Open Competitions are eligible; however, please note that any claims shot outside the county must be accompanied by a results sheet. "Masters" records may be claimed by archers over 50 years of age.
