To all stout Longbowmen of England come try your skill at a tournament held to celebrate our beloved Patron Saint the noble St George. In the forenoon you may practice your skill at a Western Round for which two magnificent trophies will be awarded. For our younger Countrymen [ladies] shooting suitable shorter Westerns trophies according to entries will be presented. Then if you have a mind and the courage to, you may stand in the line shoulder to shoulder with the Bowmen of the Tors and face the enemy as we recreate the battle of Agincourt and show them that the power of the English Longbow has not diminished. The battle will take place on the field of Notre Dame on the Sabbath Day the 18th day of the month of April in the year of our Lord Two Thousand and Ten

We will be honoured by the presence of Lady Paramount Lady Frehane of Tors. The elected Field Captain is the veteran archer Lord Vitale of Kartley. For the battle the English Bowmen will also be led by Lord Christopher Vitale of Kartley - as the King's Herald.

For those Noble Bowmen who wish to test their skill a King's Tax of Four Golden Pounds will be levied and they should assemble on the field of battle at Ten of the clock in the forenoon.

The King's servants will show you where to leave your wagon and tether your horse when you report for duty on the day. As the King is short of provisions bowmen should bring their own bread and cheese, however, to quench their thirsts, hot and cold beverages will be available. Prior to the morning round, a small repast will be prepared to Break your Fast with a cooked slice of the Pig in a crust of bread for the sum of a few Groats!

For the shooting of the Western Round the rules of that ancient body the Grand National Archery Society will be strictly observed. The Agincourt Battle will be shot according to the rules laid down by the King's Herald and will be scrupulously adhered to.

Beware! Any unchivalrous act will be punishable by death.

The King's Tax will be collected by the Bowmen of the Tors.

DIRECTIONS If entering the City from East or West - use the City Ring Road [Parkway] and exit North on A886 signposted Tavistock. Then travel under the flyover, exit first left at the Roundabout signposted Tamerton Foliot into Launceston Lane. Entrance to School 400 yards on right Notre Dame Close (will be marked). If coming from North to Plymouth on A886 exit right into Launceston Lane at Devonford Roundabout ignore signs for "Airport", "College" & "Hospital" then enter the School as above
