Good News for Barebow Archery update

In my last newsletter, I published details of the inclusion of Barebow by WA and the proposed changes to the AGB rulebook. Part of my article mentioned AGB's interest in receiving feedback from Longbow archers regarding whether or not they would welcome similar changes to elimination rounds and match play in the future. As promised, I have been in contact with Archery GB to find out how we can provide feedback. Barebow at WA Tournaments

As some of you may be aware, World Archery have now recognised Barebow as a bow style for target archery. It has put a few more restrictions on Barebow than AGB have, although it is expected that AGB will change so as to match WA in the future.

The main difference is that the unbraced bow complete with all permitted accessories must be capable of passing through a hole or ring with a 12.2cm inside diameter. This is the same size as the 10 ring on a 122cm face. You will now see at WA tournaments, that Judges will at equipment inspection have a bow ring to check that the bow conforms to the rules.

They will also check that any weights fitted to the bow have only hard washers and not soft ones that can absorb shock. Another item that is regularly overlooked, is the area around the sight window is free from any marks, blemishes, protrusions (including any colourings on the riser that could be used for aiming). If there are any marks, then the area needs to be taped. The tape needs to be long enough, so as the ends of the tape cannot be used for sighting.

With arrows, the arrow wraps if fitted must not extend further than 22cm when measured from the throat of the nock. As is the same for AGB, the max diameter of the arrows is not to exceed 9.3mm.

Stitching on the Finger Tab must be uniform in size and colour. Also marks or lines may be added to the tab or on a tape placed on the face of the tab. These marks must be uniform in size, shape and colour. Additional memoranda are not permitted.

These points are extracted from the WA rules and are not exhaustive. Please check the full details on the WA Website (rule 11.4).

Dress Regulations at Tournaments

We regularly have to remind archers about the dress regulations. The main points of contention are that any colour garments can be worn, with the exception of **BLUE DENIM**, **OLIVE DRAB** (if you are not sure what this is, look it up on google), and **CAMOUFLAGE PATTERN**.

Camouflage is not necessarily greens and browns but can be any colours. It is the disruptive pattern that makes it camouflage.

Shirts for gents must have sleeves and for ladies must not be strapless.

Any clothing must be appropriate, clean and in good condition (i.e. not frayed or worn, either deliberately or by use) and must be conventional in style and appearance.

On all clothing, manufacturers trademarks are allowed as is the wearers name.

Individuals, and members of clubs and other archery organisations that are commercially sponsored, may wear sponsors logos and names during the sponsorship period only.

Any other wording or badges on clothing must represent archery organisations.

At any tournament in this country that is judged by AGB Judges, then the clothing rule in use is AGB Rule 307.

DCAS Records

For anyone wanting to claim a DCAS County record, please remember that you have only four weeks from the date of the tournament to do this and three months for GWAS. GWAS Regional Record Claims are sent via your DCAS CRO - Scott Williams.



Claim forms are available on DCAS and GWAS websites respectively and Scott usually carry a few blank forms to tournaments; you can also hand completed forms to him personally at any shoot he attends.

Claims can be made from scores achieved at any Open Tournament, including 'Masters' claims for archers aged 50+, in addition to regular record claims. All claims from outside County must be accompanied by a copy of the results sheet.
