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Archery GB Talent Festival - 16 th to 24 th August 2014
Archery GB are holding a week of activities in August for young archers (up to the age of 20) thinking of starting out on the talent pathway, together with their parents and coaches. This week includes a talent identification day, a league shoot and workshops.
I attach details and registration forms, which are also on the Archery GB website.
Please pass this information on to any aspiring young archers in your club - the registration deadline for the various events is $14^{ ext{th}}$ June so please do this quickly.
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Funding of Level 1 Coach Courses
You may be aware that GWAS have recently changed the way they contribute to the cost of coach courses: instead of the previous policy of offering a lump sum to archers taking courses they are now offering an amount equal to the funding offered by clubs and by County. Applications for funding have to be made on the form available from the course manager (copy available on the GWAS website at http://www.gwas.org.uk/misc_docs/coachgrant.pdf).

This doesn't change the principle on which DCAS offers funding, which was on a very similar basis intended to encourage clubs to support their archers to gain coach qualifications. But we have slightly modified the terms, as below, to reflect the change in the GWAS approach.

DCAS will make a contribution to the cost of members taking Level 1 Coach courses equal to the contribution that the member's Club agrees to make and on the same terms as the member's Club agrees to contribute. This funding is offered subject to:

- successful completion and passing of the Level 1 Coach course by the member
- the member and the Club being affiliated to DCAS
- the member and the Club applying for alternative funding sources that are available, including from GWAS (all such funding sources to be disclosed with the application for reimbursement)
- · a limitation of £100 maximum contribution from DCAS for up to 2 archers per year per Club
- the total of contributions from all sources not exceeding the cost to the member of taking the course including ancillary expenses (such as travel, accommodation, paperwork, etc).

You will note from this that, although GWAS will only contribute to the cost of the course, DCAS will also contribute to travel and accommodation expenses if the club contributes to these ancillary expenses. This recognises that in our County archers may have to travel a long way to access a course.

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Junior Fund

Also a reminder that DCAS will make loans of up to £400 to enable Juniors to buy equipment.

If you have Juniors who are interested in representing their County at the Grand Western Intercounties Tournament on 6th September then please give them this form and encourage them to register their interest as soon as possible.

As explained on the form, all interested Juniors should register their interest as soon as possible so that they can be tracked - they can send in scores later.
