Jan Martin has had great success in the past month. Shooting at Lilleshall in the Masters, Jan won the Head to Head in the FITA round, and in doing so gained a new national record. Shooting on the Sunday saw Jan coming 2nd overall for the weekend.

At the GNAM Jan won the Double Hereford round. In an exciting Head to Head for the FITA720 Jan was again triumphant. Jan is pictured right with Jill Newland, who came second. The trophies are for highest overall score, highest 80 yard score, highest national score and most golds.

At the GWAS Dunster Championships, some of our members did very well. Bob Griffiths-Bird won the Compound Double York making him 'Champion of the West'. Charlotte Brown came 3rd in the Recurve Western round. Bob and Charlotte are members of Yelverton Bowmen.

Timothy Pratt of Exmouth Archers came 3rd in the Recurve Western Round. Redruth Archers also had success with Jimmy & Sally Sandoe winning the Jack and Jill award in the Westerns.

The Field Archery shoot on Tuesday saw Tony Collins 1^{st} in the Freestyle, and 2 members of Exeter, Andy Oakes 3^{rd} in the Longbow and Phil Rees Barebow with the highest unrewarded score.

At the Royal Bath & West Show Paddy Johnson was beaten in the semi-final by just 1 point.

We are very proud of their representation for our Sport at these prestigious events. Perhaps they might like to put pen to paper and tell us how it went in time for the next edition of the Newsletter.

At the GWAS Indoor Championships on February 6th 2002, at Weston-Super-Mare, Jan Martin was placed first in the Ladies Recurve. Peter Phillips came 3rd and Bob Young also of Archers of the West was placed 4th. Well done to you all.

Now that I have <u>finally</u> got the official list of increased affiliation fees from GRAND NATIONAL, I can now let you know what the new fees for the coming year 2002/2003.

There is no increase for either Region [GWAS] or County [DCAS] so the breakdown in the fees payable for all **NEW MEMBERS** are as follows:-

Please remember that in a Junior Club all Juniors new and re-affiliating pay a DCAS fee of £1.00. [this goes into the Junior Fund to be used for the benefit of Juniors]

Although the annual fees are not due until the end of September, if you send the fees to me before 31st August, 2002, your club will receive a 5% rebate on the GNAS Fees.

Hopefully, most of you will be familiar with the completion of the annual returns forms, but when completing the forms before you send them to me please make sure you cross out completely the names of any members who are not renewing their membership and amend the final totals on the forms so that they agree with the cheque**made payable to DCAS** you send me

Please do not add any new names to the Returns Form, but use the "new membership" forms for this purpose. Also, the Pink Form that accompanies the annual returns forms should be completed with the names and addresses of new members and sent direct to GNAS not to me.

DCAS Junior Fund

Below is a copy of a letter sent to all club secretaries from our County Treasurer detailing the makeup of the DCAS Junior Fund.

This is just to accompany the annual fees letter and to inform you on the updated criteria for the administration of the DCAS JUNIOR FUND.

It is basically the same criteria as a letter I sent out in 1993, but this will show how the fund is made up and how the funds are applied

Sources into Fund:

Individual Junior Fees to County [currently £1.00 per head]

A limited supply of Wales Archery Vouchers

Rebate of the Junior Team's Entry to GWAS Intercounty Tournament [less £10.00 administration fee [This is to be ratified at the next GWAS Council Meeting].

Any surpluses from Junior Coaching Events.

Application of Funds:

Grants to any Junior Archer for:

- Clothing
- Travel; up to 20% towards travelling expenses when attending Regional, National and International Shoots (Ed: These are shoots organised for Juniors-only)
- Squad Training
- Coaching
- Purchase of Equipment by advancing 12 month interest free loans (up to £150.00 repayable by Direct Debit)

Free Pass to one of the DCAS organised shoots [recharged to County Tournament Organiser's Account]

Cost of printing above free passes

Wales Archery Vouchers for taking part in the JAWS Scheme*

- £5.00 for placing in the top 10
- £3.00 for placing in the top 50
- £1.00 for placing in the top 100

Wales Archery Vouchers for taking part in the AAS [Association for Archery in Schools]*

- £5.00 when winning the Gold Badge
- £3.00 when winning the Red Badge
- £2.00 when winning the Blue Badge
- £1.00 when winning the White Badge

I hope this will encourage more Juniors to stay with the sport, and that the information is helpful when you get asked what is the DCAS Junior Fund?
